Greater Cincinnati region's 100% virtual festival

In order to be able to effectively plan our festival, we have made the decision that it will be 100% virtual.

Elements of our festival

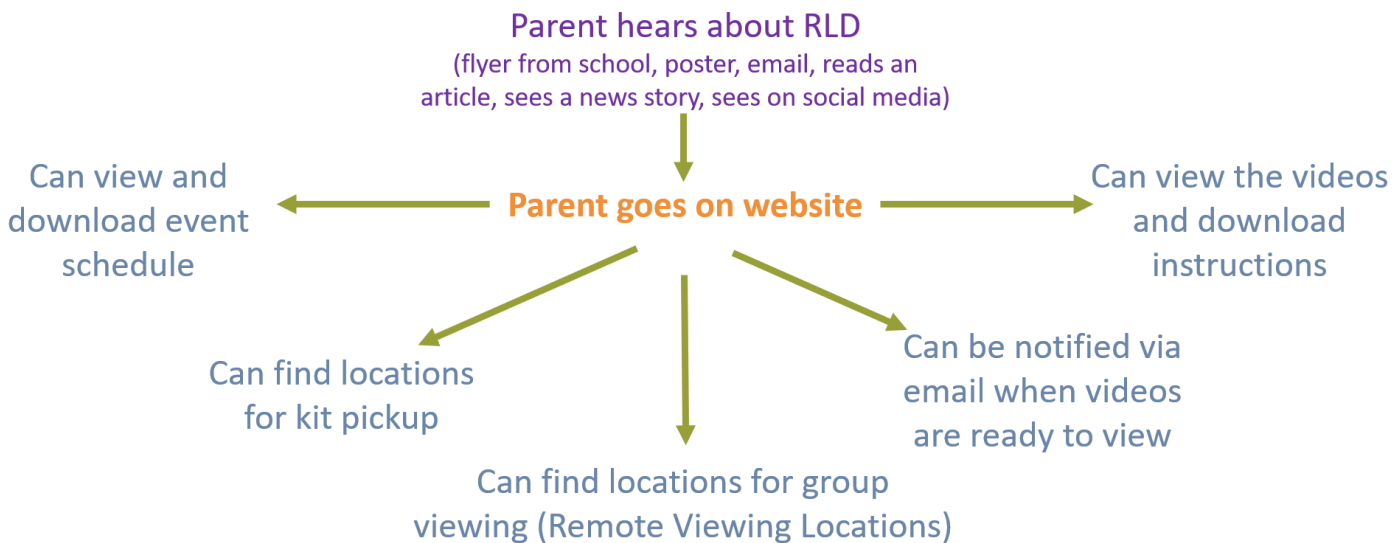
- Online lessons, activities and demonstrations, either pre-recorded or interactive
- Downloadable written instructions
- Free kits with materials to do several activities*
- Premade playlists for each day of the festival

*The kits will be free and include materials and supplies for a predetermined selection of the projects and lessons in the festival. They will be distributed by community partners, focusing on low-income neighborhoods (see page 8).



Parent Journey

Here is how we envision the journey for parents and caregivers who are interested in the festival:





Roles for educators (anyone with a skill to share) and community organizations:

- **Event host** (if you teach a lesson, give a demonstration or lead an activity, Remake Learning Days calls you an event host)
- **Remote viewing location** (plays the “show” on one or more days of the festival to kids and families who gather there—see more on page 8)
- **Kit distribution hub** (distributes kits to families who want them —see more on page 8)

“Event host” levels of participation:

- **Teach a lesson or give a demonstration either in a pre-recorded mp4 video or as an interactive session (via Zoom or another platform). Stipend: \$75**
- **Provide written instructions for your lesson or activity (as a pdf). Stipend: \$50**

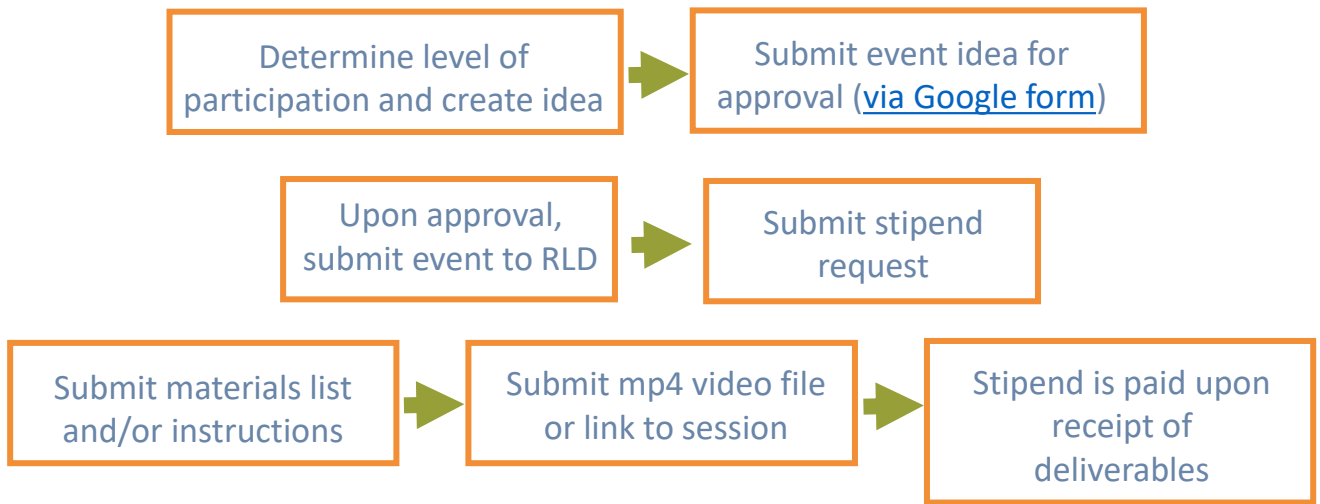
You can submit more than one video and you can also submit videos that you recorded previously.

The videos can be any length, although 30 minutes or less is probably ideal.



Event Host Journey

This is the process and timeline for being part of our 2021 festival:



Timeline:

- Jan. 31 Deadline to submit your ideas
- Feb. 7 Deadline for us to notify you about approval
- Feb. 12 Deadline for hosts to submit their approved ideas and apply for stipends on RLD website
- April 16 Deadline for deliverables (mp4 files/link for live sessions, written instructions)
- May 3-7 Kits are distributed
- May 15-17 Festival!



Additional info:

- **Remote viewing locations**

We would like to partner with organizations such as Boys and Girls Clubs, community centers, libraries, afterschool programs, etc. The organizations would simply play our “show” (the YouTube playlists of pre-recorded videos) to their visitors/customers/members. Of course, COVID restrictions may ultimately prevent this.

- **Kit distribution hubs**

These could include the Remote Viewing Locations and other organizations who would help distribute the free kits to interested families. The kits are available to anyone, but our specific focus is on underserved or low-income families. We will deliver a predetermined number of kits during the first week of May to the hubs, which they will then help to distribute before or during the May 15-17 festival.
